DOWNLOAD FESTIVAL

Roads around Donington Park will be busy this weekend

Highways England is advising music lovers heading to Download at Donington Park in North West Leicestershire this weekend (Friday 8 to Sunday 10 June) to plan their journey and give themselves plenty of time.

Road users not heading to the festival are being advised to seek alternative routes to avoid delays.

Gates to the campsite open at midday on Wednesday 6 June to allow an expected 60,000 or more campers to spread their arrival times. Up to 20,000 visitors are expected to buy day tickets so the surrounding roads are likely to be very busy.

A specialist traffic management and car parking contractor, 'SEP Limited,' have devised a traffic management plan designed to minimise delays experienced by visitors to Donington Park and other road users close to the event.

The festival organisers, Festival Republic, are also encouraging as many people as possible to travel by bus, coach or train. Shuttle buses will be running to get people from Derby and Loughborough train stations.





Sarah Redfearn, Highways England's Emergency Planning Officer for the East Midlands, said: "Major roads and motorways in the area, including the M1, A42, A50 and A453, are likely to be busy.

"All routes to the festival will be well signposted, but people travelling in the area should plan their journey in advance.

"Festival-goers can check the traffic conditions using our Highways England travel app, or follow us on Twitter @HighwaysEMIDS to check the latest traffic updates before you set out."

Highways England will use electronic message boards on surrounding motorways to advise people of any delays. Traffic officers will be supporting SEP throughout the event around junction 24 of the M1, to assist motorists, clear incidents quickly and keep traffic moving.
